#### Aims of the event

The aims of the event were to raise awareness of Skin and Prostate Cancer and inform people what is happening locally around prostate cancer.

#### The Event

The event was opened by Stephen Shore the Chair of Healthwatch Doncaster who went on to deliver a presentation about the organisation, its functions and its vision for the future. This included an appeal for more people to become active members.

Carolyn Kerr, Health Improvement Officer with Public Health in Doncaster delivered a session around Skin Cancer. The aims of the session were to increase people's knowledge of the early signs and symptoms of skin cancer, the importance of using sun protection and how to reduce the risks of developing skin cancer. The session included an interactive quiz and an in depth power point presentation and was very well received.

The final presentation of the morning was from Richard Metcalfe the Head of Strategy and Delivery At Doncaster CCG (DCCG) who gave a presentation around prostate cancer. This included information on the local position, stating that Doncaster has the second highest incidence of prostate cancer in the South Yorkshire and Bassetlaw area but that this is still below the national average. The recent trend is that mortality rates for Doncaster relating to prostate cancer are decreasing which is encouraging and reinforces the need for early detection to be a priority. With this in mind DCCG have held targeted campaigns in 2013 and 2015 around the signs and symptoms of prostate cancer and the importance of anyone who may think that they are affected consulting their GP at the earliest opportunity.
